Information furnished in conformity with the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space

Note verbale dated 23 August 2024 from the Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna) addressed to the Secretary-General

The Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna), in accordance with article IV of the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space (General Assembly resolution [3235 \(XXIX\)](#), annex), has the honour to transmit data on space launches by the Russian Federation in July 2024 and on previously launched space objects that ceased to exist during that period (see annex).¹

¹ The data on the space objects referenced in the annex were entered into the Register of Objects Launched into Outer Space on 29 August 2024.



Annex

Registration data on space objects launched by the Russian Federation in July 2024*

1. In July 2024, the Russian Federation did not launch any space objects included, in accordance with established practice and its international obligations, in the register of space objects launched by the Russian Federation and over which it exercises jurisdiction and control.
2. In July 2024, the Russian Federation did not launch any space objects on behalf of foreign clients.
3. The following space objects ceased to exist in July 2024 and were no longer in Earth orbit as at 2400 hours Moscow time on 31 July 2024:

2022-096Q (SXC3-217 Siren), which burned up on 6 July 2024;

2022-096N (ReshUCube (SXC3-2111 (SibSU)), which burned up on 21 July 2024;

1984-027A (Cosmos-1544), which burned up on 23 July 2024.
