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Information furnished in conformity with the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space

Note verbale dated 19 November 2024 from the Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna) addressed to the Secretary-General

The Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna), in accordance with article IV of the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space (General Assembly resolution [3235 \(XXIX\)](#), annex), has the honour to transmit data on space launches by the Russian Federation in October 2024 and on previously launched space objects that ceased to exist during that period (see annex).¹

¹ The data on the space objects referenced in the annex were entered into the Register of Objects Launched into Outer Space on 2 December 2024.

1. In October 2024, the following space objects under the jurisdiction and control of the Russian Federation were launched:

2. In October 2024, the Russian Federation did not launch any space objects on behalf of foreign clients.
3. The following space objects ceased to exist in October 2024 and were no longer in Earth orbit as at 2400 hours Moscow time on 31 October 2024:
- 2022-096K (Skoltec-B1), which burned up on 4 October 2024;
 - 2022-096B (Polytech Universe-1), which burned up on 9 October 2024;
 - 2022-096C (Polytech Universe-2), which burned up on 18 October 2024;
 - 1982-092A (Cosmos-1408), which burned up on 27 October 2024;
 - 1986-006A (Cosmos-1726), which burned up on 30 October 2024;
 - 1986-075A (Cosmos-1783), which burned up on 30 October 2024.
