Information furnished in conformity with the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space

Note verbale dated 17 March 2025 from the Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna) addressed to the Secretary-General

The Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna), in accordance with article IV of the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space (General Assembly resolution [3235 \(XXIX\)](#), annex), has the honour to transmit data on space launches by the Russian Federation in January 2025 and on previously launched space objects that ceased to exist during that period (see annex).¹

¹ The data on the space objects referenced in the annex were entered into the Register of Objects Launched into Outer Space on 23 April 2025.



Annex

Registration data on space objects launched by the Russian Federation in January 2025*

1. In January 2025, no space objects under the jurisdiction and control of the Russian Federation were launched.
2. In January 2025, the Russian Federation did not launch any space objects on behalf of foreign clients.
3. The following space objects ceased to exist in January 2025 and were no longer in Earth orbit as at 2400 hours Moscow time on 31 January 2025:
 - 2023-045A (Cosmos-2568), which burned up on 2 January 2025;
 - 2017-042F (Mayak), which burned up on 16 January 2025;
 - 1982-059A (Cosmos-1378), which burned up on 23 January 2025.
