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Information furnished in conformity with the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space

Note verbale dated 26 March 2025 from the Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna) addressed to the Secretary-General

The Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna), in accordance with article IV of the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space (General Assembly resolution [3235 \(XXIX\)](#), annex), has the honour to transmit data on space launches by the Russian Federation in February 2025 and on previously launched space objects that ceased to exist during that period (see annex).¹

¹ The data on the space objects referenced in the annex were entered into the Register of Objects Launched into Outer Space on 2 April 2025.

1. In February 2025, the following space objects under the jurisdiction and control of the Russian Federation were launched:

2. In February 2025, the Russian Federation did not launch any space objects on behalf of foreign clients.
3. The following space objects ceased to exist in February 2025 and were no longer in Earth orbit as at 2400 hours Moscow time on 28 February 2025:
- 2020-068F (Yarilo No. 2), which burned up on 9 February 2025;
 - 2014-087A (Resurs-P No. 2), which burned up on 12 February 2025;
 - 2024-145A (Progress MS-28), which was deorbited into the Pacific Ocean at a predetermined location on 26 February 2025, fragments of the space object that had not burned up were sunk;
 - 2024-166A (Cosmos-2577), which burned up on 27 February 2025.
