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Information furnished in conformity with the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space

Note verbale dated 25 April 2025 from the Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna) addressed to the Secretary-General

The Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna), in accordance with article IV of the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space (General Assembly resolution [3235 \(XXIX\)](#), annex), has the honour to transmit data on space launches by the Russian Federation in March 2025 and on previously launched space objects that ceased to exist during that period (see annex).¹
