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Information furnished in conformity with the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space

Note verbale dated 12 November 2025 from the Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna) addressed to the Secretary-General

The Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna), in accordance with article IV of the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space (General Assembly resolution [3235 \(XXIX\)](#), annex), has the honour to transmit data on space launches by the Russian Federation in September 2025 and on previously launched space objects that ceased to exist during that period (see annex).¹

1. In September 2025, the following space objects under the jurisdiction and control of the Russian Federation were launched:

2. In September 2025, the Russian Federation did not launch any space objects on behalf of foreign clients.

3. The following space objects ceased to exist in September 2025 and were no longer in Earth orbit as at 2400 hours Moscow time on 30 September 2025:

1983-122A (Cosmos-1515), which burned up on 4 September 2025;

1983-037A (Cosmos-1455), which burned up on 4 September 2025;

2025-041A (Progress MS-30), which was deorbited on 9 September 2025; fragments of the space object that had not burned up were sunk at a predetermined location in the Pacific Ocean;

2025-181A (Bion-M No. 2), which landed on 19 September 2025; the descent module, which was carrying the results of experiments, landed at a predetermined location.
